Rev'd and Dear Sir,

I am truly sorry for those unhappy differences which sometime ago were the occasion of so much disquietude in this settlement and, that I was in any way involved in them. In my communications to you by the Hathorne which for want of time were cast upon loose papers, I endeavoured to avoid harsh expressions against my colleagues as much as possible, and you would not then have heard any thing unpleasant from me, but I did not know what to do. My heart was full of grief and trouble. I do not know what complaint my colleagues might make. I would not minimize that I have been always right and they always wrong, neither should I, I trust, vindicate any

parts in my own conduct which were justly
blameable. Thus far, however I humbly hope,
I may be permitted to say, that it is the Lord who
in his infinite condescension to me, has called
me to the work in which I am now engaged.
If there is, in any of my transactions as a Missionary
settler my evil it is from myself, if my good
it is of the Lord's doing. I desire to bless him
for it. I praise him that his God and staff
are my comfort. I pray thus I may be inclined
to go on with a single eye to his Glory and to
be made useful in promoting his Kingdom among
the Native where I now rejoice. It is also
my study to give satisfaction to the Society
whose servant I am. Next to the displeasure
of my Heaven by Master nothing would grieve
me so much, as to forfeit the good opinion
of the Society. They will not expect perfection from

me because there is no such thing in the world.
Nor do I hope where I ~~carried~~^{was offered at}, that I should be
so blind to my own spiritual interests as to receive
unfriendly reproof from good men. But generally
speaking, I do not think I could continue
in this situation, without I was persuaded firmly,
that I was acting with the cordial approbation
of the Society.

I have the Missionary Register bound in boards
for the first year. I shall be glad if you will
send me a volume in Boards for each succeeding
year. One copy of loose Missionary Registers
to be sent as opportunity offers. And a
Board volume for each year for the use of
our Library would suit us well. Some Mission
ary Register must be left at N. Wales by
mistake I have not one by me dated
later than July. 1815. I am ready dear Sir
