My Dear Sir

I have sent my Letters open to Lord Bathurs[t], for your Inspection and the Committee's – When you have read them I will thank you to forward them to the office of his Lordship – I should wish M^r Goode (Caroline Place) to see them as he is well acquainted with the Concerns of this Colony. You will see I was very desirous to return to Europe – My way is hedged up by the hand of Power, [f] and therefore I must remain at present. All is for the best – I do not murmur at this Disappointment, well knowing that if it had been right for me to come to England, it would not have been in the Power of the Governor – he could have no Power against me except it was given him from above –
