The Father of John King, whom I have introduced to the Society as a settler in New Zealand, came over to me yesterday at Wotton. The measures which his son ^{is} ~~are~~ taking are greatly distressing to him & he earnestly pressed me to represent his feelings to the Society. I told the old man that John King acted perfectly voluntarily & that no constraint would be offered him either by the Committee or myself but that, as he was of age, perhaps the Society would consider him as entitled to act on his own judgment. I promised however to write expressly to you on the subject, which I now do, & to beg that every enquiry may be
