happy to say as members of Society they have behaved
well they are sober, honest, moral and industrious
men - and have not suffered their good to be evil
spoken of. On this Account I am fully satisfied with
their Conduct. But with respect to the mission
they have not acted as they ought to have done
and have given me much Venation, and I could
as I could not prevail upon them to attend to the
natives of New Zealand when I had them living
in my House - when Mr. Kendall arrived I wrote
to Mr. Hall, a Copy of which letter I will send for you
and that of the Society's
the private information, if I have time to take one
before the vessel sails. From this letter the Society will
see the Spirit of Mr. Hall. His Statement has had
the best effect upon his mind - he did not imagine
that his Conduct had been so improper till I
