I was very much gratified with the arrival of Mr. Kendall and his family as it determined me at once, to attempt the mission. I waited upon the Governor, and informed him, what was the ultimate object, which the Society had in view in sending him out. when he ~~inquired~~ ^{we} ~~was~~ building two schoolhouses neither of them were ready, or Mr. Kendall would have had one of them. It will be some time before they are completed. In consequence of this Mr. Kendall has an opportunity to visit New Zealand before he enters upon any work in this Colony. when I sent the letter, I did not think it prudent for any of the missionaries Parrillas to go - but only Mess^{rs} Kendall and Hall. Mr. King remains at Parramatta. As his going would not have been attended with any advantage, till they all go, should Providence open a way for them. I have directed Mr. Kendall to bring over with him a Chief, in order that we may make some arrangement with him for the future settlement of the missionaries, and that
