

Panamatta, but the child is dead, so that I have five children still living.

I must conclude by observing that I indulge the hope that the Society will not be too sanguine in their expectations of success in this undertaking. As far as I am concerned, I should know but little of myself, did I not feel conscious of my own inability. Even an attempt to fix the language of the New Zealanders so that they may be instructed in their own tongue is a great work, and cannot in the way nature of things be accomplished for some years to come. And I should shrink from such an attempt did I <sup>not</sup> know that the Society will be satisfied provided I do my best and leave the issue to God. What I do, it is my intention to forward home. And I shall think myself happy if any toil of mine will stimulate others of greater ability to come forward in behalf of a People <sup>terrible</sup> from their beginning "heathens" but who are included in the promises, and will ultimately be favored with the sound of the Gospel.
