

N.B. Should the Society succeed in the formation of a Settlement at New Zealand, One Settler must not have to depend upon another, in my opinion, in any thing of a temporary nature. For instance if Mr Hall should build a house for me, I must of course pay him for it. Our affairs must be kept separate or else we shall not long agree with each other. I shall endeavour to treat the Settlers with respect, but they will think and act for themselves. Mr Marsden has always considered Mr Hall in the light of an ordinary Mechanic, but he does not think himself bound to work in that capacity.
