The natives to be treated with the greatest kindness while you
remain there and every thing to be done that can with
prudence to gain their confidence. You will inform them
that it is my intention to visit them when the vessel
returns, and that I wish a chief to come over to Port
Johnson in order that I may enter into some arrange-
-ments with him for their benefit.

With respect to the articles you may bring back
in the vessel, then must depend upon circumstances.
I should wish you to bring as much Flax as you possibly
can. Such Spars and Timber as you may with Mr. Hall
judge valuable. Pork if it is to be obtained and I call for
Horn or any other Natural Productions. I wish you to
fill up with Potatoes. They had better be kept in
the baskets in which the natives bring them as I think
they will keep better that way. On the Sabbath Day
I wish Mr. Kendall to read on board when the weather
will permit the Prayers of the Church. And when you
arrive at New Zealand I desire that you will be very
particular in the observance of the Sabbath Day
not to buy or sell any thing on that day but all
the sailors to be clean and do no work. Messrs. Hall
and Kendall will do all they can to procure a Cargo
for the vessel towards defraying the expenses a Cargo with you
