And to prevent all quarrels as far as possible you will not suffer any of the native women to come on board as the voyage is for a particular object.

As soon as I and Mr. Hall were embarked on board the native it was agreed upon that we should unite in prayer and praise to God morning and evening and alternately read a portion of the Holy Scripture for mutual comfort and edification.
