I have in my hands for the British & Foreign Bible Society
the sum of three pounds one shilling and five pence & for

the first opportunity. my acct with Mr Wood is closed -
so that I cannot give an order upon him for the amount -
Mr. Hall has drawn upon Mr. Hudson. I am sorry I
troubled you with his affairs, as it would mislead you if
you have sent him his salary by way of investment.

Having had no opportunity of raising money by a school
since my arrival in New South Wales and my plan being
entirely altered I shall have occasion to draw upon
Mr. Hudson for a sum of money in addition to what the
Committee was pleased to allow me. Should it please
God to bless my attempt in raising a school at New Zealand
I have no doubt but the Society will soon send a Missionary
to assist me. I shall embrace every opportunity
of acquainting you with our proceedings -

Mr. Cooper pays great attention to the religious instruction of youth in the schools at Sydney. He tells me the children are going on exceedingly well with Mr. Woods Catechisms. I have heard the female Orphan repeat the Introduction very correctly.
