influence in behalf of Moros a Native of New Zealand who  
has made application for a passport on board this vessel, but  
against whom a Detainer is held in the Secretary's  
Office by Captain Stuart.

I will undertake to be answerable for Moros's return  
to Port Jackson and if he is indebted to Captain Stuart  
five or six pounds, I will readily pay it should it please  
Divine Providence to conduct me in safety to New South  
Wales, and am, with much respect, Sir
