With respect to ourselves I think we brought over too many articles of property we ought to have come over much poorer. The Natives do indeed say great things, and our prospects are encouraging. But they are not arrived at that state that they can bear to see property before their eyes without coveting it. A Smith greatly attracts their attention. There would be plenty of work for a Smith on the other side of the Bay.
