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I am sorry to say already too many settlers of
the latter description and as soon as their services
can possibly be dispensed with they must return
to their home. I hope some truly pious characters
will be sent out by the Society, Men who will
be willing to drop every idea of self interest
and lay themselves out for the real good of
the settlement and to promote those important
objects with which it is immediately connected.
Worldly minded men have not patience enough
to bear the rude behaviour of the uncultivated
heathen. A Clergyman will be a great acquisition.

I am sorry to say that I and Mr. Hill cannot
agree in our opinions. He did not tell the Committee
the whole of his mind when he came out. In many
of his proceedings his private interests preponderate
in his estimation. He says he has cleared three
hundred pounds per Annum at New South Wales.
This is a great temptation for him to return
thither again. I am pleading with him as well
as I can.
