It is my intention to take about forty
children under my care. These must be clothed
and fed. Such brown cloth ^{and stuff} as is used in charity
schools in England would suit very well. The
clothing which can be procured from the natives
will greatly assist. With a little attention it
will do for working days. I trust I shall also be
enabled to procure plenty of Pork and Potatoes
for a few pence which will serve the school the
whole year. I shall apply to Mr Marsden for
rice or a little Peas if he should think
it advisable to let them have any bread.
In the summer I have every reason to believe
a school can be maintained at a little
