upon a stage which was erected upon the spot where  
Mr. Farmer died. The Apparel they wore at the time  
of their decease and the Tabbood articles were deposited  
with them; Munghea enclosed their Tomb with boards  
and railing. The seven Chiefs who assisted in the  
above service were not permitted to touch any  
virtuals with their hands but were obliged to stoop  
with their heads to the ground and take their virtuals  
with their mouths for some time. Mangroha was Tabbood  
three days, Munghea, two days, Pakoa three days, Englaunda  
two days, Taira two days, Guana ten days and  
Taopopo two months.

After the funeral ceremony was over, the two  
surviving wives of Auatera, his sister, mother in law  
and uncle were conducted to a hill opposite the  
Door of my Dwelling. They are to bewail the loss  
of Auatera for some time to come. No person is  
to touch them. <sup>two wives & sister</sup> Itua would be angry. No one  
hear their cries every day. Numbers of Natives come  
from all parts to join them in their weeping.
