left the harbour of Port Jackson that Mr Fop's name
was not entered in the Ship's clearance at the Secretary's
office. Secondly, there was no fair proposal made for
his maintenance during the time he should continue
on the Settlement and his passage to Port Jackson; and
it was very probable that he might be detained
here upwards of seven months, particularly if the
Active should according to my last advice from
Mr Marsden proceed to Blahaine the next voyage
after she had touched at this place. And Thirdly,
because the natives of Tappoona had expressed their
aversion to receive any of Captain Parker's people
on shore on account of the former cruelties which
he had exercised towards them. When therefore Mr
Fop came on shore he was for the above reasons told
that he must return to the Vessel.
By the same Boat which conveyed Mr Fop
