the Settlers and the Natives.

Mr Hall has removed from us to a spot
which he first pitched upon, on our voyage of
investigation. As it is ten miles distant from
Tappoon, and it would be improper for him to
leave Mrs Hall alone, he is necessarily excluded,
generally speaking, from our Society. I need not
repeat my former observations. Mr Hall will be
guided by his own judgement. I believe he is
doing good when he is. We are friendly with each
other not withstanding our different way of
thinking. We are better friends by being placed at
