The female settlers are now under no apprehensions respecting their own safety. We let them alone in their heathenish customs, and speak a word in season when we have an opportunity.

The Natives tell us that the Betsey Captain Goodenough from Port Jackson is lost at the North Cape. The Captain and crew perished except eight men who went on shore in a boat. The Natives robbed them of ten Muskets some clothing and Powder, and the sailors being afraid of their lives departed in the Boat, and we understand they are at the Three Kings waiting to see a vessel.
