and your companions. The other articles
shall be sent when there is opportunity.

Your account of Duaterra is
very affecting. May it stir us up to pray
for the wretched Heathen.

It rejoices us to observe you have
made an entrance on little works for the
instruction of the Natives in reading their
own tongue. We wish copies of all pieces
of this description, where printed, to be sent
home perhaps 20 or 30 of each.

Your Maps and curiosities
were very acceptable.

There is much interest exci-
ted here in behalf of New Zealand. Only
Shewis, by your mutual love and steady
Zeal, that there is encouragement for Christ-
ians to unite with you and strengthen your
hands, and but a very few years will pass
before many will come out to help you.
