I beg leave to refer you to my letter to Mr Pratt for particulars not noticed here. You will, and I believe all my friends near you will rejoice with me at the opening prospects of usefulness amongst the noble race. I trust the Society will be the means, under God, of raising the People of New Zealand from their low degraded condition by reason of their ignorance of Him, and of conferring eternal blessings upon many.

When I left London, it was expected I should reside at New South Wales for a term of three years before I embarked again for this place, I had therefore no particular instructions from Mr Pratt how I was to support a school here, neither has Mr Marsden expressed himself fully, to me upon this subject. At present, now I have every thing ready, as I have mentioned above, my hands are completely tied up. Through the perverseness of the Smith I have not been able to obtain a single
