I am sorry that you have had reason to be uneasy concerning me, with regard to my being in worldly ease and security at Port-jackson, this has not been the case with me, tho^{it} has been represented to you -- had Mr Marsden been his *officente* to state the truth on my side, as he was to seek an occasion against me to my hurt, things would not have been so blameable, tho^I am sensible I was to be blamed, but ~~not~~ concerning the Mission, I hope these few lines will find you in good Health as they leaves Me I am sorry to hear you do not enjoy so good state of Health as you used to do --- the last Letter I sent was full of complaints but I hope I shall have to make no more on that head
