I have now received your letter bearing date August 10. 1815. It was forwarded with the newspapers and Missionary Register by the Endeavour to this place in February last but taken to Blakely by mistake.

I intend to collect as many curiosities as I can for the Museum and to forward them by the next conveyance to Port Jackson or England.

I thank you for your cordescension in considering us as distinct settlers, and not as a collective body, and that every reasonable provision will be made for our being independent of each other. Undoubtedly we shall agree best when we have the least occasion for each others services. We are now I beseech God upon peaceable terms with each other, and I really find that strict attention to the above plan will have the best tendency to preserve peace.
