

without due examination, and to publish this in
the Government General Orders as a fact, whereas
the contrary has been proved, on the clearest evidence
before the Supreme Court. — Had the evil effects
of the Libel been confined to these Settlements, I
should not have taken any public notice of it
whatever — But as it was sent into the world,
under such an apparent public sanction, and likely
in its operation to affect the character of many
innocent individuals I felt myself compelled to
appeal to the Courts of Justice, in order to justify my
own public reputation, and to defend that of those
who are associated with me in promoting the Civiliza-
tion of the estates in the South Sea Islands —

I am informed, My Lord, that the Libel hath already
found its way to the Asiatic Mirror, and probably
before this period may also have been noticed in
other public papers in different parts of the world —
There can be no doubt but that it was the Author's
intention that it should be as publicly and universally
known, as the light of the Sun, and that it should
injure the general Interest of the Societies in the
public opinion, and expose them and their Missionaries
to unmerited odium and Contempt —

Having made the above Remarks, I leave
with Confidence, my Complaint to your Lordship's
favourable Consideration —

The recent circumstances will clearly shew the
spirit of hostility, that hath long existed against
me without cause, and the trying situation in
which I have been placed — and will, I trust also,
explain the reasons why Your Lordship was ever
troubled with any representations of my Conduct,
which I am bold to assert has been always regular & uniform.
