will receive information from me or the  
settlers as soon as possible - I think it may  
be possible that the master of the Harriet was  
aboard, as he was on board as first mate the  
Jefferson whaler, when the Captain behaved  
so ill at the north Cape. and if I am not  
wrongly informed, he was at New Sweden at  
the time Sippahsee, and his people were  
killed by the Europeans. when I hear again from  
the settlers, they will inform me what part  
while the Harriet was there. If any difference  
had happened, some of them would have  
mentioned it when the Harriet returned as they  
all wrote to me by her. Should Dr. Brown  
call upon you, he will inform you how we  
are going on. I expect nothing but war here,  
while the present Administration continues. War  
war with the wicked, is better for the Christian  
than close Connection. He will watch and pray more  
and live nearer to his God - I am Dear Sir
