We work there will go on well I have no Doubt in my own mind - I am anxious to visit them again - and have been strongly tempted to leave the Colony from the Difficulties my Situation, without giving my notice, and taking up my Residence amongst them till times change - and I sometimes think I have Scripture warrant for this.
