I think you have a select party of natives this time for their mildness and peaceable behaviour, my Scholars His Tawha and Tongnahoodoo will please Mrs. Menden. I believe them both to be stoutly honest. Tahraka is afraid of the sea, but says he will embark the next time. I expect you will see another of my Scholars whose name is Pow should Capt. Smith of the Cambler put in to Port Jackson. Capt. Watson has been here, he treated us very politely.
