

particulars. 1<sup>st</sup>. To purchase all we want from  
 the natives with the Society's Trade, and should  
 it be agreed upon to add any other trade to  
 it, for each settler to bear his proportion of  
 the expense. 2<sup>ndly</sup>. To divide the pork, potatoes,  
 Matts &c. in fair proportions to each family.  
 3<sup>rdly</sup>. To allow a certain quantity of pork and  
 potatoes per day to such natives as live  
 with the settlers. 4<sup>thly</sup>. To lay the remainder  
 of the Potatoes aside for the School. Timber, flax  
 and such articles as are wanted for the future  
 and not of particular use to the settlement  
 might be excluded from the above regulations

I have consulted my colleagues in general  
 upon this subject, and they are of opinion with  
 me that to follow the above plan would give  
 general satisfaction. There ought to be no  
 provisions of any kind sent to ships without  
 the affair of the settlement would admit.
