We must engage a boat in the morning

to take us and our luggage to Sheerness.

that the Lord Jesus would bless him,

more, and more, with his heavenly

and all other friends. But as he has written a letter, I have no doubt he has fully expressed his own feelings.

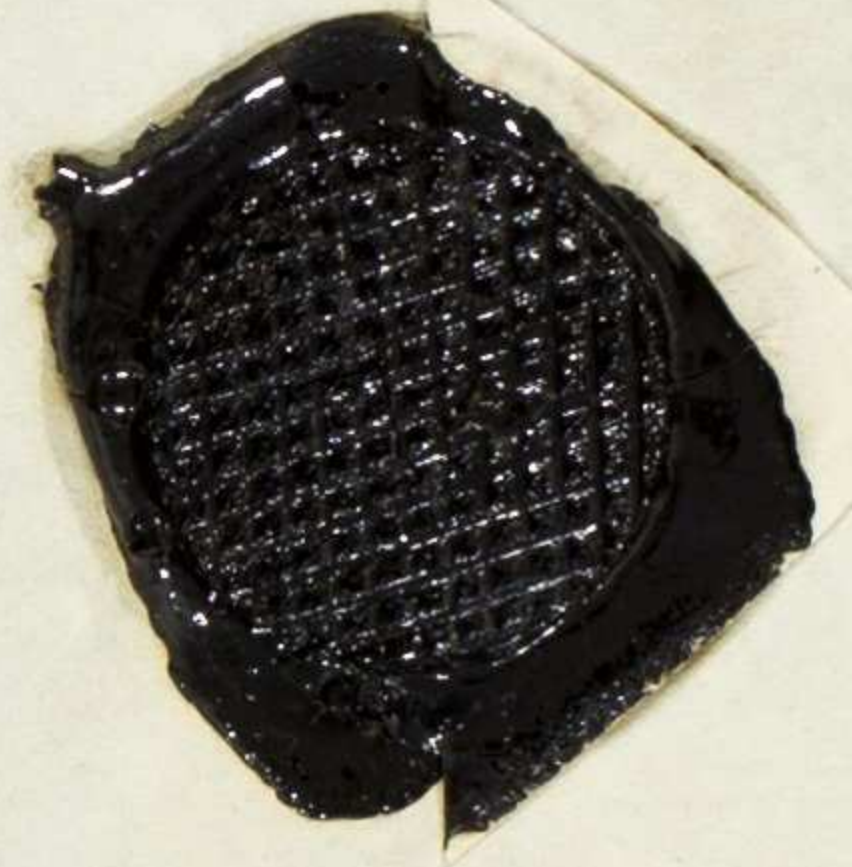
