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we went to St Peter's Church, and from thence  
we went up into the Mountains, which are full of Vines  
Orange trees, Lemons &c, we went also to see a Church  
dedicated to St Mary, called St Mary in the Mount  
we returned into the town at 12 O'Clock, and found  
brother Hall, Too, Tetteree, & Sam Butter at our  
Inn, called the British Hotel. Mr Hall inform'd  
me Captain Lamb had alter'd his mind, and  
had determin'd to stop a day <sup>or</sup> two longer and take  
in water for the Ship's Company. It was  
therefore determin'd that Mr Kemp should go  
on board to our wives, and the rest of us remain  
on shore. We all wish'd much to go up into  
the Mountains. Next Morning - We engag'd  
5 Horses for this purpose, the Horses are about the  
size of our English Ponies, they are very sure footed  
and climb the rough & craggy mountains with great  
certainty. Mr Hall (with his accustomed <sup>why</sup> Phylanthropy  
paid the expence, (with many other things) out  
of his own purse. He also bought Too and  
Tetteree some light garments for the hot  
weather, we bought our fruit &c and returned  
on board on Friday evening much gratified.  
We sail'd from Madeira on Saturday with  
a very fine breeze. Sunday ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> Feb<sup>y</sup> we had  
Divine service on Deck in <sup>the</sup> Morning. Mr Hall's  
cabin in the evening, several Soldiers attend'd
