disgraceful altogether as well as their Persons.
Whether the half-cast Children will take
to the woods remains to be ascertained.
Time will show how they will act. I do
not think the Gov^{ts} would sanction any
Interference with the natives, so as to
locate them in the same Seminary with
the War Leaders, if this could be done.
