

with a few more Friends who were all of
Opinion that the Plan would not do, and
that it would not be prudent to mention
the Subject to the Gov^{rs} at the present time.
It will be best to keep the West-Indians
by themselves as much as possible in
the Seminary. we shall therefore for the
present continue unconnected as we are.
Time may alter the present Circumstances
and something then may be done; but
if we may be allowed to judge from
what we see and know of the natives
of N. S. water, the time is not yet
arrived for them to receive the great
blessings of Civilization and the Knowledge
of Christianity. I trust from the above
Remarks the Committee will approve
of that line of Conduct with respect
to the natives of West-India we
