 The man that trades increases his substance
 amongst the natives in that particular
 way; and greatly increases the value
 of all the various necessaries & comforts.
 If a Ton of Pork is purchased from the
 natives at the Settlement, and sent to
 Port Jackson, it makes that Article
 cheaper than it would be to have that
 in our trade. when the Settlement is more
 advanced, and the Settlers have the means
 of support more within themselves, I can
 not see, there would then be that Danger
 attending private Trade as at present.

Commerce will call forth the Industry of
 the natives, and greatly improve their
 present Condition - I merely state the
 above for your Information in case any
 Application may be made to you about
 private Trade - that you may know what
