On the 4th. The Wind much the same as the Day past Mr Rumb very poorly and first to keep in Bed But she enjoy grate peace of mind I could not attend school to day.

On the 5th. To Day we are sailing much the same Mr Butter gave some Testaments away to the Seamen and Soldiers and humbly hope the Lord will Bless them to there Souls employed in School

And on the 6th. To day but little wind to day some Convicts were punished for stealing some things from the others: it was a lepon to teach ^{me} more of the Desperivity of the human heart and to give the Praise to gods grace that I am not one of them employed in School

The wind much the same To Day we injoind the Privilage of Publick Service on the quarter Deck the Revd Mr Crofs Read the Service and the first homely of the Church I think never did I so much enjoy Publick worship Before hearing for some time been debard from it: the greatest attention was paid by all. In the evening we had Service in Mr Galls Cabin and the Sacrament was administered to 10 communicants; my Soul to Day was refreshed with the means of grace Mr Rumb much better
