And on the 6th We could not make more than 15 miles, but we hope we shall soon have a fair wind the Lord enable us to wait with Patience. The custom which is generally had on board a Ship while crossing the line took place to day

Sunday the 7th Sailing about 20 mts an hour. We had Publick Service on deck Mr Croft read a sermon from the 5th of Galation & we humbly Pray that the Lord may bless at least some souls so that they may have to bless God throughout sterrity that they came on board this Ship, about noon a brig called the Hero bound to Riojaneiro came in sight and the ^{Capitan} delivered some dispatches one letter to the Society. On the ^{Evening} we had Service in Mr Hall's cabin and the Sacrament was administered to 6 ^{commu-}icants by Mr Butler I trust my soul was refreshed and strengthened with this means of grace

On the 8th Sailing with a fresh Breeze about 6 mts employed in School we cross the line to day Mr Pemb Porley

And on the 9th The wind much the same Mr Pemb hold Porley to day Jeterree attended school Mr Butler attended with him and was very attentive. The grate smearing of mankind has been trying of us but the work is the Lord's, the god of heaven have said it shall prosper therefore we need not fear

On the 10th The wind much the same employed in School Jeterree very attentive Mr Pemb much the same to day 120 ^{miles} south of the line

On the 11th Sailing with a fine wind at the rate of 9 ^{miles} Mr Pemb is but Porley suffer a grate deal of sickness when the Ship is in grate motion employed in School

On the 12th The wind much the same Mr Butler and Mr ^{of the} Hall have selected a number of convicts from the rest to teach on hour in the day that is from 11 to 12 in the morning each of us taking a class and we humbly trust the Lord will bless the means to there souls Mr Pemb something better employed in School
