And on the 23rd The wind the much the same employed as the Day past It grieves me to say that our two new Zealanders are not so attentive Tovi have not behaved so well as he did some time back Mr Hall requested him and we all endeavored to show him that it was so. but he afterwards was very sorrowful but he have not been so attentive Mr Hall's journal will relate the particulars with out doubt Mehemiah that it shall prosper

On the 24th The wind blowing very fresh and it thundered and lightened a grate deal employed in school Mrs Hunt pretty well
