And on the 8th The wind not so rough sailing with a gentle breeze Mrs Hemm better to day employed as usual

Sunday the 9th The wind much the same No service on Deck the weather would not admit of it Mrs Hemm better we had service in Mr Hall's Cabin morning and evening Mr Butler read a sermon in the morning from the 3rd of Proverbs 17 was and in the evening from the 1st of Psalms our souls were refreshed in our meeting together to worship our heavenly father

On the 10th Sailing with a fair wind very fast employed in school the last 24 hours the ship sailed 206 miles it is the greatest distance we have run since we have been out

On the 11th The wind much the same Mrs Hemm milder employed as usual in school. we hoped that by the time we reached new south wales they would have improved more than they have but I trust if they continue to attend they will improve more we humbly pray the loved to give them that service daily

And on the 12th Sailing with a fair wind the night past a woman 73 years of age died her name was Watton feature was quite worn out she was going with her husband to new south wales. to day morning a man one of the convicts died and there bodies were committed to the deep this evening. the loved grant that may be led to sick god by fervent prayer
