We have ~~had~~ <sup>on Sundays</sup> had Divine Service, regularly in Mr. Halls, Cabin throughout the whole of our Voyage; we have had also a regular family worship & reading the Holy Scriptures morning and evening. These means of grace have been a source of the greatest comfort and consolation to us. Our blessed Lord has indeed manifested Himself to us, in a peculiar manner; and made us to rejoice in His mercy & goodness, when we have called upon His Holy Name in one corner of the ship. In the school we established among the Convicts, the Lord was <sup>there also</sup> ~~with~~ us, and we <sup>have</sup> good reason to believe that our labours were not in vain in the Lord, many were brought to attend regularly on the reading of Gods word; and we <sup>have</sup> good reason to believe that the precious seed of divine truth hath been sown in the hearts of several of them: and we earnestly pray, it may be watered and nourished, by the Holy Spirit of Grace, until it bear fruit an hundred fold. We all had some little illness in the course of our passage, some more, some less than the other, but in bodily infirmity, Sister Kempf suffered the most, being poorly nearly the whole way, but I bless God she is much better at this time. But afflictions; (like other things) have been made to work together for our good.
