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Saturday 5 Feb. 1819

A.M. Light breezes and delightful fine weather - Tectonae sulky at his lesson this morning and would not attend at all in the afternoon. The Lord give me the wisdom of the Seraph and the firmness of the Dove to deal with him and Tooi and to do them good, and to be patient with them. P.M. of the weather is fine. Tomorrow it is intended to haul Tectonae on the quarter Deck. The Lord be with Thy Minister and enable him to break the bread of life to the people, and be with our little party in breaking of bread in the Evening. Lat 38.18 Long 11.26

Sunday 7 Feb. 1819

A.M. I thank Thee O Almighty Lord for Thy mercies on this intervening Sabbath - Arose at 6 and had a short prayer with Tooi & Tectonae after breakfast. Mr. Butler read a Chapter and engaged in prayer. At 10 o'clock the Church rigged out on the Quarter Deck. The Captain - Officers - Papangora - Talon - Soldiers and Crew attended Divine Services - Mr. Croft read the prayers, and one of the Hermits of the Church - I read the responses - The Lessons and gave out the Psalms - after dinner each of the board had half a pint of wine and we embraced the opportunity of giving a tract to each - God Almighty hear the prayers of the praying people on board this ship and grant that good may be done in the name of Thy Holy Child Jesus Most Holy Keep I myself met in the Afternoon and read the Holy Scriptures of Truth and in the Evening the Service of the Church read by Mr. Butler after which the Sacrament administered by Mr. Butler and Mr. Croft. Mr. Roberts was one of the Communicants. Fair warm pleasant weather. Lat. 37.9.48 Long. 12.19.

Monday 8 Feb.

A.M. Delightful fine weather a breeze from the N.E. sending us Madeira where we expect to be tomorrow or next day. The Lord is very gracious unto us in giving us a fair wind, and the old ship is said to sail better than she has ever done before - Employed with T. T. Debesse and with the New Zealand Language. - Not very well in health and in some pain, but the Lord is gracious.

Tuesday 9 Feb.

A.M. Running for Madeira night before the wind most delightful weather, similar to what we have in England in June Employed as before. Lat: 34.20 - Long. 14.54

Wednesday 10 Feb.

A.M. Charming fine weather - at day light saw Porto Santo one of the Madeiras and soon after the Island of Madeira. at Noon we were about 20 miles from it - at 5 standing off and on a few miles distant from Funchal which we continued to do during the night Mr. Butler and Mr. Kemp went on shore - A vessel in sight said to be a Pirate. -
