I have already mentioned to you my intention to send my son to England for his Education; and I hope you will soon see him after the arrival of the herring in which ship he comes to Europe. I cannot say as yet what Profession he may wish to follow. my object is that he should have such an Education, as will fit him for an useful life. Should he have no desire to enter into the Church, I should then wish him to apply to medicine, when he is properly qualified to enter upon that study. In the mean time I have directed that he should be sent into weeks to the Seminary, where Mr. Hapsett now is: as Mr. H. will be a good Companion for him, till he gains a little more knowledge of the world. It was not possible to give him an Education in this Colony, for want of Schools. Should he live, I may want your kind advice about him; as soon as he is ready, especially if he should
