Nearly two years after
William Hall returned from New Zealand he
made out an Account against the Society
to the amount of £ 43. 1. 8. at the time
he was discharged I conceived he was
indebted to the Society, and as I had no
Reason but to believe that the whole of his
Demand was unjust. and not only so
but that he had robbed the Society's
Stores to a large amount, I could not
admit his Claim. The matter came to
be investigated before the Supreme Court,
where he produced witnesses to swear to what
was false - I was reduced to the only alter-
native either to admit his unjust Demand
or to bring the Letters from New
Zealand to prove the Falshood of his
Statement, as the Court could not, or
would not admit any written Evidence
