I received yours this morning with the inclosed which I am very much obliged to you for, I have spoke to Cap^t Kern respecting better accomodations but the ship will not afford better, being full of passengers in the cabin, Cap^t Kern has promise to do all he can for our comfort, Sir you mentioned in yours dated 20 that ^{you} had wrote to Cap^t Kern to provide tea & sugar for Mayree I show him your letter this morning, but he has not taken any notice respecting it yet, upon the whole Cap^t Kern is very kind ~~and~~ wishes to make us comfortable as he can. We have had very hard gales from the West, ^{now it is} calm and we hope the Lord will favour us with a fair wind shortly that we may proceed on our voyage, Mayree is but poorly having a bad cough at present, Mrs Lowell John and Mayree sends their regards to you Mrs B Mr Pratt and all friends
