original purchase money: but as there is now
every reason to believe that success will attend
the Society's labours in these Islands I am anxi-
ous to be relieved from such a great charge.
I should hope from the arrangements I have made
with Mr. Kemmide of Liverpool; who is now
returning to England; and whom I have requested
to wait upon you as he is arrived in London,
that the proceeds of her present voyage will go
pretty far towards paying for her if she is at
all fortunate - I had got all the supplies on
board of her for the Settlement, and also a
number of the natives who were returning
home when the Drumming arrived but as
the Drumming is going to the Bay of Islands
I have taken out all the supplies, and the
natives also and put them on board the
Kings Ship, at least the natives will accompany
me. so that the Arctic will have nothing
to do for nine months, but to look after
a cargo - which will be immediately sent to
England - on the account of it to you -
Should a regular communication be
opened between Port Jackson and N. Zealand
in time the Society may perhaps do with-
out a vessel - much has been done already
towards the Civilization of the natives
