

the natives of the Island - He has gained their Confidence  
which is a matter of the first importance - and  
I am sure he will treat them at all times with  
Kindness - I have wrote a line to your Right  
Honorable President my friend Gambier - Mr  
Jernie will explain his wishes to you, should  
he have any Intention of returning to this Country  
and I shall feel myself much obliged if you or  
any other members of the Society will forward  
his views, should you have it in your Power to do  
so with those in Authority, and it should be  
deemed necessary - I have sent by Captain Jernie  
a Patoo Patoo, which was presented to me by a Chief  
of Mercury Bay named Awarree, on the 22<sup>d</sup> of  
July 1820 - in consequence of having brought about  
a Reconciliation between him, and Timunaranga  
a Chief at the Bay of Islands - who had fought  
an hard battle in the beginning of this year  
in which Timunaranga was Victor - A great number  
were killed, and Timunaranga took 200 Prisoners -  
I shall write to you more fully on my  
return to N. S. Wales -
