Rev. J. Mendenhall's Memorandum
to Mr. Hornode. 25

Mr. Butler will go with Mr. Hornode for the
Church Missionary Society a wooden spatula
with which the head chief's wife was digging her
potato ground amongst her slaves, when the
Rev. Mr. Mendenhall and Butler visited the
potato garden of her husband, whose name
is Shenaga, altho she is a woman of the first
rank in New Zealand and quite blind yet she
was labouring as hard as any common slave.

Mr. Mendenhall desires Mr. H. to say to the
Rev. Mr. Pratt, that finding his wants less than
he expected, he has drawn only for £300 and
not for £700 as advised in a former letter,
that he does not intend to draw on that
account any further sum until he hears
from the Society -

Mr. Hornode will receive
any letters, instructions, written or verbal

from Mr Pratt to Mr Morrison on the
subject of either the Active or the Expedition
at New Zealand or New South Wales.
