 wrong - and if I cannot make it appear
 so now - this will appear in the morning
 of the Resurrection of the Just - In the testimony
 of my conscience I rejoice - If my Superiors
 in England condemn me, from the false
 representations of my Superiors in this
 Country I must submit - It will not stain my
 conscience with guilt - I feel I am in the
 situation where God would have me be.
 tho' like Jonah I have wished to flee from my
 post - I have now no cause to complain, for I
 have seen the kind hand of Providence
 directing all things for the best, and causing
 the wrath of men to praise him -
