

A considerable Assistance to us - Some one of
the corresponding Committee I hope will
occasionally visit the Settlement at St. Helena
and watch over the concerns of the
Society there - If it should meet the Approba-
-tion of the Committee to purchase a larger
Vessel than the Active, one about two hundred
Tons, we are of opinion that greater benefit
would accrue to the Society, as the Active is
too small for the Fishery - A Vessel of 200
Tons would be navigated nearly at the
same Expence - There would be more
Room for the natives on board, as they
are all generally anxious to be Sailors;
and if any Gentleman wished to visit the
Settlement with a view of promoting the
Ages of the Society he could do this with
more Speed, and be better Accommodated
I think the Society would run no Risk
