

by inhaling such quantities of Fire stones
and Gun powder - Now this evil can be
remedied I know not - It is a very great
one; and one into which most of the
missionaries themselves have fallen -
I enclose the last letter I received from Mr
Hull in which he mentions his Cattle, and
solicits a remuneration for them as they
were killed by the natives - Mr. Butler
ought to pay for more himself - It was an
Act of his own - and not a very innocent one -
The missionaries are now beginning to see
the value of Cattle. The Society have two
Cows and two Calves - at Red Tree Ridge -
Mr. Butler wishes to purchase one of these
Cows with her calf - Mr. Francis Hull the
other from the Society - Should they be sold
the price of the former should be \$30 - the
latter \$25 - when they get Cattle of their own
they will take care of them - and I think
no more will be shot -
