in various Settlements, but has received no
Salary - He will do my duty during my
Absence - Should I bring over with me a
number of native youths from the
Island I purpose to place them under
the care of the Rev. Mr. Gifford - Should
he not succeed in obtaining an Appointment
as one of the Chaplains of the Colony -
Perhaps the Society for the Propagation
of the Gospel in foreign Parts might
be induced to extend their Patronage to
him, if they were made acquainted
with the real state of these Settlements
where so many thousands of British
Subjects are in want of the public
Ordinances of Religion - I shall leave all
these subjects to your Consideration - Should
you deem them worthy to be mentioned
to the Committee of the B. M. S. I
will thank you to do so - I have also
sent some Documents to Mr. Gray for
the Society's Committee - containing my
Letter to Dr. Douglass and his answer - This
Letter when written was never intended
to be sent out of the Colony - as I thought
Dr. Douglass would comply with my wishes

I urged the Government to allow the wages to come to Copenhagen, but the letter was to Douglas
