

3^d That the Storekeeper with the assistance of the Missionaries and Lay Settlers shall make out a list of Articles for Barter and the general purposes of the Mission from time to time which list shall be approved by at least two thirds of the Brethren and shall afterwards be forwarded to the Parent Committee if the Articles required are to come from England and if from New South Wales the demands to be forwarded to the Society's Agent in that Colony

4th That all houses, Stores, Gardens, Lands and every thing else which may be erected upon or procured by or for each Missionary Station shall remain the sole property of the Missionary Society, and that no Buildings or Gardens shall be injured by any individual whatever when he retires from the service of the Mission but be left entire for such Missionaries who may be appointed from time to time to those Stations

5th That the produce of every kind of Labour or barter procured by the Missionaries or the Natives at the expense of the Society shall be carried to the credit account of the Society for their common good.
