anchored in the Bay of Islands, on her way to Bounty Island, whither she was bound for Seal skins. Duaterra embarked on board this vessel, commanded by a Mr. Moody. - After she had taken in her supplies from New Zealand, she proceeded on her voyage, and arrived at Bounty Island in safety, when Duaterra, with one of his Countrymen, two Otahaitans and ten Europeans, were put on shore to kill seals, and the vessel then sailed to New Zealand to procure potatoes, and afterwards to Norfolk Island for Pork, leaving the fourteen men, whom she had landed, with very little water, salt provisions and bread.

When the Santa Anna arrived off Norfolk Island, the master went on shore, and the vessel was blown off, and did not again make the land for a month.

About five months after the Santa Anna left Bounty Island, the King George arrived, commanded by Mr. Chase: but, previous to the arrival of this vessel, the sealing party had been greatly distressed, for more than three months, for want of water and provisions. - There was no water on the Island nor had they any bread nor meat excepting seals and sea fowl. - Duaterra often spoke of the extreme sufferings which he, and the party with him, endured from hunger and thirst.
